'Stairway to Yesteryear'




We continue to make good progress in our efforts to secure the \$166,500 needed to complete our 'Stairway to Yesteryear' project. September 1st our Historic Site Preservation Grant (HSPG) requesting \$83,000 was submitted. Gary Mahannah (City Administrator) was very helpful in preparing the

HSPG application. The City Council voted to provide up to \$42,000 for our project. From our mailing of about sixty fund raising pieces we received eleven responses. We certainly appreciate those very generous responses. We had ten contributors prior to the mailing. We also have verbal commitments of support that have not yet made a contribution or pledge. Our fund raising efforts continue. We will not know whether we were successful with the grant application until December. So, we need everyone to keep their fingers crossed through December for good fortune with our grant request and additional contributions. If we are fortunate enough to be awarded our grant requested funds we could have our project completed in 2008.




