<u>Largest Stone in Polk City Cemetery</u>



About eight feet tall with a ten foot base weighing several tons, the GRAEBER stone was placed sometime in the early 1900's. It was shipped to Polk City by train in three pieces. A reinforced wagon, pulled by Pete Harmon's steam engine, was used to haul it

to the cemetery. The bridge over Big Creek needed reinforcement to support the wagon. The wagon broke down and was repaired during the trip. Pulling the wagon up the incline into the cemetery proved to be a herculean task even with the power of Mr. Harmon's steam engine.
